PRINCIPAL'S / ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Some of the great strengths of our school are flexibility and action when things just don't go the way they are supposed to. Our students, teachers and parents demonstrated these admirable gualities last week in Sydney on the year 6 excursion. The Big Smoke gave our parents the opportunity to put out fires, apply first aid to ladies in distress and to help move 30 students through peak-hour train crowds. I understand there were a lot of sleep-ins on Saturday morning. The Year 6 students had to cope with last minute changes to daily activities and a complete change of lifestyle for the week. After a weekend of rest I have also recovered from the Year 6 excursion. Our school excursion program gives students an opportunity to not only learn things first-hand but also to find their personal limits and find out new things about themselves. Teachers and parents freely give up their time to support these excursions, (teachers do not get paid extra for excursions), and it is appreciated.

The school has had to cope with the outage of our electricity supply for the last two Tuesdays. Teachers modified their teaching and lessons progressed as normal. All coffee and tea issues were catered for creatively.

Congratulations to the Junior Chess Team of Pippi, Thomas and Ellena, who won the All Schools C-Grade Chess Competition.

The Day of Action at the Jetty was well-attended with many parents and teachers from local public schools airing their concerns about the cuts to Public Education. I would encourage every parent to make themselves familiar with the impact of the cuts on their child and inform their local member, Mr Andrew Fraser and the Premier, Mr O'Farrell, how they feel about the issue.

Students are showing patience as they wait for the newlyplanted fruit trees to bear fruit. Last Friday, students from Kindergarten and Year 5 planted citrus fruit trees on the verge and on the school boundary as part of the Sawtell Healthy Homes Program funded from the NSW Government's 'Our Living Coast Regional Sustainability Program'. The tree planting was supported by the Coffs Harbour City Council with site identification and hole preparation. Erika Van Schellebeck was the driving force behind the initiative organising the materials and plants. The students involved in such community based projects develop a positive attitude towards community and respect for community property. The school continually encourages students to be involved in their community and this was a perfect opportunity for them to put their community spirit into action.
