PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The busy season is upon us.

I enjoyed my brief visit to Cascade last Thursday evening. A big thank you must go to Mr Trice and Mr Moore and the parents who made the excursion possible. Mr Pyne the Federal Education Minister reported yesterday that the government will not be honouring the Gonski funding model after this year. This will have an impact on Public Education in NSW and our school. Please keep yourself informed of this issue as it will affect your child's education.

There is a planned <u>stop work meeting</u> for teaching staff for next Tuesday morning, 3^{rd} December from <u>9:00am to 11:00am</u>. This is an unfortunate time of year for this to occur but there are many issues related to the threats to the funding of schools, schools reclassification and teacher salaries that will be discussed at the meeting. I am anticipating that we will have a majority of our staff at the meeting and minimal supervision at school until 11:00am. Another note will be sent home this week with more details on the impact of the stop work meeting on student supervision.

Our intensive swimming scheme lessons began this week. These lessons help to ensure that all students who leave the school can, at minimum, swim to save themselves and be water safety aware. Kindergarten will be in the pool next week.

The P&C has been successful in receiving a grant for the creation of seven sustainability themed sculptures within the school garden.
