

Please note that weekends and Public Holidays are Non Working Days. All bookings not cancelled by this time will be charged at full fee.

FEES: Depending on the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) and activity hours a parent is entitled too, the out of pocket costs to parents can range from a few dollars to the full rate shown below. It is governened by the NSW Early Childhood Directorate, a sub department of the NSW Education Dept. (both seemingly running their own races with little or no collaboration) To add mud to the waters the sector is funded and overseen by the Federal Govt.( also seemingly running its own race with little or no collabration with the states!) I will be the first to commend the Federal governments fiscal management of the Childcare Industry during the initial impact of the Covid Crisis in 2020 as it allowed us to stay in operation to support the families and help keep those that could work, working.
